

2022 North Central Washington Regional Envirothon Rules

1. Team members must be registered in grades 9-12 for the current school year.
2. Any alternates attending the regional event will be grouped with alternates from other schools/groups to form a team in order that they may gain the experience of the competition.
3. Alternates may be substituted at state competition if they are registered at their local competition. Teams going to the state competition must consist of five members in order to be competitive. At the state competition, teams not consisting of five members will be allowed to participate, but will not be considered in the competition ranking. Any alternates attending the state event will be grouped with alternates from other schools/groups to form a team in order that they may gain the experience of the competition.
4. An adult advisor must accompany the teams. Advisors may use the competition time as they choose, but are not allowed to have any contact with their teams during the competition.
5. The Envirothon shall consist of five test stations based on soils, wildlife, forestry, aquatics, and the current environmental issue – Waste to Resources.
6. Each county winner is eligible for the state competition that will be held towards the end of May or beginning of June. Location TBD.
7. The judge's decisions are final on all events.
8. Transportation, water, and lunches will be the responsibility of each participating team. There is usually water onsite but bring water bottles.
9. School medical release forms shall be provided by the school for each team member. Please bring a copy of the medical release form that the event hosts can keep. Any team member who does not have a completed medical release form at the contest will not be allowed to compete.
10. The winning team is the team with the highest cumulative point total from the five test stations. If there is a tie, the scores will be compared next by the aquatics test, then the forestry, then the wildlife, and lastly the soils.
11. If a winning team opts not to attend the state competition, the team with the next highest score is eligible to attend in their place.
12. Any student possessing or using tobacco or intoxicants on site will force his/her team to be disqualified.
13. Rules are subject to change. Any and all relevant changes will be explained to all teams and advisors the day of the event.
